


Community Action Plan: Strengthening Notting Hill

Notting Hill's Story

Notting Hill is like an island. It is a community bounded by major roads, which has created some advantages and some disadvantages to the area.

Developed in the 1950s Notting Hill was the first planned residential community by AV Jennings (the Westerfield Estate) and it maintains a strong sense of community pride amongst its residents. It is a pleasant pocket to live in with reduced traffic flow through the area creating a quiet residential haven.

There is also an industrial part of Notting Hill, separated by Blackburn Road, which has a significant daytime working population and is a successful location for a number of businesses.

In the residential area, the only shopping strip is largely vacant, with some small offices and limited retail outlets. Following the closure of Notting Hill Primary School and Monash High School there are limited opportunities for the community to interact socially. Residents need to travel out of the Neighbourhood to access other areas for schooling, sports, shopping and other services.

Notting Hill is one of the closest residential communities adjacent to Monash University. It is also close to the Monash Freeway, significant industrial areas and the Monash National Employment and Innovation Cluster.


Notting Hill would benefit from stronger links to adjacent suburbs, an increase in diverse open space activities and more opportunities for residents to build social connections with other local residents.

What did you tell us? What do we know?

Notting Hill has a business/industrial area to the West and a residential area to the East surrounded by major roads. It is close to Monash University and the Monash Freeway.

Notting Hill has 3,475 residents. The residential community can be identified as predominately students in the West and families in the East.

The Western side of the Notting Hill residential area has a median age of 26 to 29. More than 25% of residents are attending University. More than 50% of properties are rentals and more than 60% of residents were born overseas (the majority from China). The Eastern side of the Notting Hill residential area has a median age over 32, with more children and older residents living in the Eastern area of Notting Hill.



Through consultation Council has built up a picture of the local community and the issues and actions that could be further explored to improve the liveability in Notting Hill. Many of the actions within this plan are reliant on further resources and budget. Partnerships with state government, business, community organisations and community members will be developed to seek further resources and financial support for the implementation of the plan.

Insights;

- Notting Hill is a proud community and the majority of residents regard it is a pleasant place to live.
- There are strong associations between Monash University and Notting Hill, and the University is driving change in Notting Hill by a regular turnover of students who live in the area.
- The suburb is somewhat isolated by major roads and there is a lack of opportunities for the community to interact socially and build connections.
- There is a need to provide better links outside Notting Hill and Projects need to focus on refining the use of open space and community facilities.
- As the Notting Hill Community Association (NHCA) no longer operates. A local leadership group could be re-established to replace the Notting Hill Community Association.

Projects that could be developed to provide a significant change to liveability in Notting Hill;

- ✓ Establish better pedestrian links across major roads to suburbs surrounding Notting Hill.
- ✓ Establish a Community Leadership Group to identify issues or opportunities and develop places and programs for greater community integration and social connection.
- ✓ Improve the existing public spaces by providing better places for people to interact, with infrastructure such as seating, all weather paths and gardens as well as flexible designs that allow new activities to be introduced.

What we need to work on:

The following table is a list of potential place making improvement projects for Notting Hill. This list will remain active and open with additional projects added as the need arises. Project work, completion and priority order are all dependent upon future funding decisions by Council as part of its annual budget decision-making process ability to successfully secure external grant funding.

Improving pedestrian links out of Notting Hill.	Notting Hill would benefit from better links for pedestrians where they cross Ferntree Gully Road, the Monash Freeway on and off ramps and Blackburn Road. A higher level of pedestrian separation and safety at crossings would improve the confidence of parents or carers and their children accessing services (schools, shops) independently. The proposed Westall Extension by Vic Roads is an opportunity to include higher grade pedestrian infrastructure such as pedestrian bridges, better protected / higher priority pedestrian signals along Ferntree Gully Road. The key access point into Monash University is at Duerdin Street, better links to the South and infrastructure, such as wider paths, protected crossing points, lighting, wayfinding and seating is needed. Additional warning signs and other Traffic Management Devices to improve safety for Pedestrians will be investigated.	N&PM, Transport Planning, City of Monash, Vic Roads.

Identification of cycling routes and their enhancement within the context of the Monash Walking & Cycling Strategy.	Cycling paths and linking points to be considered and incorporated into Monash's Walking and Cycling Strategy. Also consider way finding signage, a connection to Mile Creek and the feasibility for cycle infrastructure on Duerdin Street and the South side of Normandy Road between Blackburn and Gardiner Roads. Identification of possible events and programs in Notting Hill to increase community interaction.	Research what programming and events could be established via the Notting Hill Neighbourhood House and at other locations to increase community interaction. Look to support events such as; the dogs' day out market, a food truck night and build other events on this model. Improving the open space in Business Park Drive.	Workers in business industrial areas need either opportunities to rest or interact with others. Consider the improvement of open space in this area to refine use by local workers.	N&PM, Horticulture and Active Monash, City of Monash.
Develop a local community art project plan	Locations need to be identified for mural and art commissions as well as community art work events.	N&PM to identify locations and work with Arts and Culture and Urban Design to develop a community art location map. Work with Local Leaders to prototype test programs. City of Monash.
Identify local interaction locations and develop local programming.	These locations could be established or enhanced with new uses and infrastructure. Additional programming can also be added. Examples include community harvest teams, hobby programs, also a "Place mat Program" (Signs in public places which act as a start off point i.e. meet here at 7am to walk the dogs together).
