## 7.1.2 TPA/45026 - 36 MELINGA CRESCENT, CHADSTONE - EXTENSION OF TIME

#### **MOTION**

That Council resolves to issue an Extension of time to Planning Permit No. TPA/45026 for the construction of two double storey dwellings at 36 Melinga Crescent, Chadstone pursuant to the provisions of Section 69 (2) of the Planning and Environment Act 1987.

for the completion of the development be extended by a further one (1) year. The
development must be completed by 11 May 2026.

## 7.1.3 GLEN WAVERLEY CIVIC PRECINCT PROJECT - OUTCOME OF COMMUNITY CONSULTATION

- Notes that community consultation on the detailed design (Milestone 3A) of the Glen Waverley Civic Precinct has been completed in accordance with Council's decision at its meeting on 27 May 2025 and which consultation occurred between 23 June 2025 and 27 July 2025 (5 weeks duration) via:
  - a) an on-line survey focusing on the design via ShapeMonash.
  - b) letters to residents and schools in postcode 3150.
  - c) article in the July edition of The Bulletin distributed throughout the municipality;
  - d) Project team attendance at meetings of Council's various Advisory Committees; and
  - e) a public drop-in session on 8 July 2025 at the Glen Waverley Library.

(collectively "community consultation").

There were 2,355 visitors to the ShapeMonash page and 150 contributions to the survey including a total of 107 contributions from the community to survey question 6. There were 3 written submissions received by email and an additional 6 responses to the survey completed by visitors to the library. The outcomes of the community consultation are contained in this report and the Attachments.

- 2. Notes that the predominant themes that emerged from the community consultation were:
  - a) Design, Brickwork and colour scheme
  - b) Uses of the Building
  - c) Parking and Accessibility
  - d) Sustainability
- 3. Agrees to progress to the next steps of the project which are:
  - a) Finalising the design (which will include providing the architect with the community's feedback for consideration of any changes, where appropriate) and preparing and releasing tender documents for the early works package which includes a new substation and relocation of the diesel generator which is programmed to be completed prior to the demolition of the library.
  - b) Progressing Milestone 3B, preparing and lodging an application for a planning permit for works within the Heritage Overlay (HO71).
  - c) Progressing Milestone 4, construction contract and tender documentation.

#### 7.3.1 HUMAN CAPITAL MANAGEMENT SYSTEM 2025008

- 1. Awards the tender for the provision of a Human Capital Management (HCM) System, Contract No. 2025008 for:
  - Part A. HCM System to Workday Australia Pty Ltd for a schedule of rates-based contract with an estimated contract value of \$1,340,368 for the initial term and an estimated total contract value of \$5,427,709 inclusive of all available extension options and a contingency of \$500,000; and
  - Part B. HCM Implementation Services to Intecrowd Pty Ltd (as Workday's proposed implementation partner), for an estimated total contract value of \$1,021,800, inclusive of a fixed price implementation cost of \$921,800 and a contingency of \$100,000
- 2. Authorises the Chief Executive Officer or her delegate to execute the contract agreements.
- 3. Notes that Part A, HCM System Contract 2025008A will commence as early as September 2025, with an initial term of three years, with two separate extension options of three years each and authorises the Chief Executive Officer or her delegate to approve extension options subject to satisfactory performance.
- 4. Notes that Part B, HCM Implementation Services Contract 2025008B, will commence as early as September 2025, with an anticipated contract completion date of mid-2027 and
- 5. Notes that Part A, Human Capital Management (HCM) System Contract 2025008A the estimated schedule of rates contract value stated above includes anticipated growth and indexation (please refer to the Financial section for more information).

#### **That Council**

- Commits to develop and implement a training program for councillors to build capacity on understanding family violence and all forms of violence against women (including responding to disclosures of family and sexual violence, and sexed/gendered harassment, links to sex and gender equality and primary prevention); and
- 2. Writes to relevant Ministers to advocate for a mandatory component on gender equality/primary prevention as part of the Councillor induction under the Local Government Act. In addition, support the continuation of the Free From Violence Local Government Program in future.

#### 9.1 MANDATORY CARDED GAMBLING TRIAL

#### **MOTION**

#### **That Council**

- 1. That Council Withdraws its support for the State Government's mandatory account-based gambling trial, due to the lack of mandatory and binding loss limits as a feature of the trial.
- 2. Continues working with the Alliance for Gambling reform and urges the State Government to reinstate a mandatory precommitment pilot, with independent evaluation and a statewide roll-out plan, alongside complementary harm-reduction measures (e.g., reduced operating hours and fewer machines in high-harm areas)
- 3. Advocates to the State Government to recognize Council as an equally important stakeholder as industry, ensuring its involvement in all significant decision-making processes for the trial
- 4. Advocates for other Councils to be included in the trial, importantly, those most impacted by gambling harm including other local government areas within the top 10 for gambling losses
- 5. Submits a joint letter of advocacy to State Government with other top 10 loss councils or trial site councils advocating for harm prevention to form a key part of the trial
