## Proposed Tree Species Options

Council's Street Tree Strategy team has identified the following species using the most appropriate species for the location.

Our goal is to strengthen the already established street scape in Golf Links Avenue and this selection is fitting with the existing established trees along the road.

### *Acer platanoides* (Norway Maple)



An adaptable, narrow growing tree with a strong, even branch structure. Generally a pest and disease free tree that requires little to no maintenance once established. Can tolerate moderate levels of drought. Yellow colour in autumn is held for a long period.

#### **Mature Size**

**Height x Width (m):** 10 x 4 m

**Form:** Straight Truck with Columnar Shape
