

Street Tree Renewal Information – Macrina Street, Oakleigh East

The table below lists the details of the trees to be removed. Please refer to map below for replacement details.

No	Location	Species	Condition Assessment
1.	1/77 Macrina Street	<i>Malus sp.</i>	Sucker growth from stump, will not develop into well-established street tree < 2 Years ULE
2.	27 Macrina Street	<i>Malus sp.</i>	Sucker growth from stump, will not develop into well-established street tree < 2 Years ULE
3.	1/10 Macrina Street	<i>Malus sp.</i>	Large wounds on trunk of tree, will not develop into well-established street tree, < 2 Years ULE
4.	16 Macrina Street	<i>Ligustrum lucidum</i>	Tree declining, little to no amenity expected, < 2 Years ULE
5.	50 Macrina Street	<i>Pittosporum undulatum</i>	Dieback in tree canopy, lower canopy comprised of suckers, wounds with brown rot in lower trunk, < 2 Years ULE

*< 2 Years ULE - with a useful life expectancy of less than two years

Proposed Tree Species Options

Option 1 – Single species (both sides of the road)

<i>Malus tschonoskii</i> (Pillar Crabapple)	
Power line and Non-Power line side	<p>This is an upright tree with leaves that cover its branches with pink flowers in spring. This hybrid, disease-resistant deciduous tree has a vase-shaped crown with oval, purple-green or reddish green leaves that emerge with the flowers. In mid-spring, flower buds arise all along the bare branches and open.</p> <p>Mature Size (h x w): 7 x 4m Form: Upright</p>
	

Option 2 – Single species (both sides of the road)

<i>Callistemon viminalis</i> (Weeping Bottle Brush)	
Power line and Non-Power line side	<p>This is a pretty, bird-attracting native tree with a heavy crown due to the profusion of brilliant red flowers in Spring and Summer. It is the weight of these flowers that gives it a pendulous habit.</p> <p>Mature Size (h x w): 6-8 x 6-8m Form: Pendulous</p>

Option 3 – Single species (both sides of the road)

Brachychiton populneus x acerifolius 'Bella Pink' (Bella Pink Hybrid Brachychiton)

Power line and Non-Power line
side



This is a small to medium-sized shade tree offering glossy green foliage and pretty clusters of salmon pink, bell-shaped flowers in Summer. As a grafted tree, it is more compact in size which makes it highly suitable for domestic landscapes. Flowers attract birds.

Mature Size (h x w): 8 x 4m

Form: Broad domed
