

MAP - Infill Planting


The map below details infill plantings.

Proposed Species Options

Option 1 – Combination of Species

<i>Acer campestre</i> 'Evelyn' (Queen Elizabeth Maple)	
<p>Power line side</p> 	<p>This is a small to medium deciduous tree with upright branching habit. Small leaves with rounded lobes, dark green in summer turning yellow in autumn. Flowers are green and inconspicuous.</p> <p>Mature Size (h x w): 8-10 x 7m Form: Round</p>
<i>Acer truncatum x platanoides</i> 'Taggart Sunset' (Truncatum Hybrid Maple)	
<p>Non- Power line side</p> 	<p>This very attractive small to medium-sized Maple has glossy, dark green, sharply-lobed leaves, which change to a multitude of yellows, oranges and reds in autumn. Moderately fast growing, it is known to perform well in trying conditions. Flowers in late spring.</p> <p>Mature Size (h x w): 12-15 x 10m Form: Upright</p>

Option 2 – Single Species (both sides of the road)

<i>Corymbia ficifolia</i> 'Wildfire' (Red Flowering Gum)	
Power line side and Non-Power line side	
	<p>This is a tough and compact Australian native that puts on a brilliant display of fiery red flowers throughout the summer months, providing an abundance of food for nectar-loving birds. This variety forms a dense canopy consisting of numerous branches and large, glossy, dark green foliage, which is highlighted by the lighter green undersides of the leaves. During the warmer months new foliage emerges with a reddish tinge.</p> <p>Mature Size (h x w): 6 x 3-4m Form: Round</p>

Option 3 – Single Species (both sides of the road)

<i>Olea europaea</i> 'Swan Hill' (Swan Hill Olive)	
Power line side and Non-Power line side	
	<p>This tree has slender, greyish-green foliage with a silvery underside. It is a relatively slow grower that responds well to pruning, however if left unpruned, it can grow as tall as it does wide. Bark is pale grey in colour and although this variety does produce white flowers in spring it is a low to non-fruiting variety.</p> <p>Mature Size (h x w): 7-10 x 7-10m Form: Round</p>
